Please find important information for Term 3 below:

1. Start of Term 3

- 1.1 All Clementians are to report to school on 30 June 2025 (Mon). Morning flag raising will be held in the hall on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Students are to report to their classrooms on Tuesdays and Thursdays. For safety reasons, Clementians who reach school before 7.05 am are to report to the school canteen, and will only be allowed to proceed to the hall or classes after 7.05 am. Please remind your child/ward to bring a Mother Tongue story book for silent reading on Mondays and Tuesdays, and an English story book for Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
- 1.2 Lessons will be suspended on Mon, 30 Jun 2025 as all Clementians will be involved in our Do-It-Right Programme. It is an official school day and school will start at 7.30 am and end at 1.30 pm.

All Clementians are required to bring a small bag containing a Mother Tongue story book, water bottle, pencil case and a snack.

2. Safe Management Measures

- 2.1. We would like to remind parents and Clementians to continue exercising social responsibility. If your child/ward is unwell, he/she should seek medical attention and/or rest at home.
- 2.2. Temperature-taking exercise will be conducted in **Term 3 Week 2, on 9 July 2025 (Wednesday)**. Please ensure that your child/ward **brings a working Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) to school every day**. Please replace the batteries in the ODT or buy a new one if it is not working.
- 2.3 We have observed that some Clementians have been running across the school driveway in a hazardous manner to reach their parents' cars after CCA and remedial sessions. To prevent accidents and to ensure everyone's safety, parents will no longer be allowed to park in the school premises while waiting to pick up their children after dismissals from after-school programmes. Instead, parents are advised to use the nearby public carpark. During these times, only school buses will be permitted to park within the school compound. We seek your understanding in this serious matter.
- 2.4 Smoking is prohibited by law within 5 metres of the school compound. We seek your cooperation in ensuring that this regulation is followed at all times. Maintaining a smoke-free environment around the school is essential for the health and well-being of our students, staff, and visitors.

*In view of the school closure for Primary 1 to Primary 5 Clementians due to the PSLE Oral Examination on 13 and 14 August, we would appreciate it if you could make the necessary childcare arrangements.

4. Encouraging Students to be Independent

4.1 In the Start-of-Year parent notification, we had sought parents' / guardians' cooperation to help Clementians develop good self-management skills and be more independent. Clementians should learn to take personal responsibility to ensure that they are ready for school. This involves completion of homework, packing of school bags and personal belongings for the next school day. Parents / caregivers should refrain from delivering these items to school, with the exception of essential medication.

4.2 Since Term 2, our protocol at the security guardhouse has been updated. Please note that parents / guardians will not be permitted to deliver items to Clementians, with the exception of essential medication. If your child/ ward has forgotten his/her pocket money, he/she may approach the General Office for assistance.

4.3 We seek your understanding and cooperation to partner the school to help foster greater independence and sense of responsibility in Clementians.

5. Assessment Schedule for Primary 6

Please refer to the table below for the period of assessment for the Primary 6 Preliminary Examination. More details will be disseminated via PG by Term 3 Week 2.

As the school aims to optimise curriculum time and encourage a culture of continuous learning rather than learning just for examinations, lessons will resume after the Year-End Assessment. This year's Year-End Assessment (YEA for Primary 3 to Primary 5 Clementians, excluding Oral and Composition) will start from Term 4 Week 6. The detailed Year-End Assessment schedule will be sent out via PG by the end of Term 3.

6. **National Physical Fitness Award (NAPFA) – Primary 4**

NAPFA test is one of the measures of one's physical fitness. During PE lessons, Clementians learned about the various test items in the NAPFA test and how these can be used to measure the different components of health and fitness.

Our Primary 4 Clementians will take their NAPFA 5 stations on Thursday afternoons in Term 3 Week 5 and 6. For the 1.6 km walk/run test item, it will be conducted during PE lessons between Term 3 Week 4 and 8. Details and schedules will be sent via PG nearer the dates.

7. **Sports Education Programme (SEP)**

In our effort to extend students' learning of PE beyond the curriculum, one module of Sports Education Programme (SEP) is scheduled in Term 3 for Primary 3 to Primary 5 Clementians to sign up. The module for SEP would have 6-8 sessions that take place from 2.00 pm to 3.30 pm on Mondays or Thursdays. More details will be sent via PG.

8. **2025 P1 Registration Exercise – Phase 1 Registration**

Phase 1 registration is for a Singapore Citizen (SC) or Permanent Resident (PR) child born between 2 January 2019 and 1 January 2020 (both dates inclusive) and has a sibling currently studying in our school.

For the 2025 P1 Registration Exercise (**2025 P1 Ex**), parents who are registering their younger child under Phase 1 are to **register during the Phase 1 registration period from 1 July 2025 (Tuesday), 9am to 3 July 2025 (Thursday), 4.30pm** through the P1 Registration Portal. The school has sent a notification pertaining to this on 20 May 2025 via PG.

9. **Upgrading Works During June 2025 School Holidays**

9.1 **Upgrades to Indoor Sports Hall (ISH), Louvre Windows, and Level 4 Toilets**

The school upgraded the ISH lighting to energy-efficient LED lights to save energy and support the environment. The better lighting also improves safety for students and the public, as the ISH is open for public use on weekends under the Dual-Use Scheme (DUS) managed by ActiveSG. During the June holidays, we also replaced the louvre windows in all classrooms. In addition, fixed louvre panels at staircases, toilets, and other parts of the school were replaced. Level 4 male and female toilets were upgraded as part of our ongoing facility improvement programme.

9.2 **General Repairs and Redecoration (GR&R)**

The school completed its five-year GR&R project in June 2025. Interior and exterior repainting began in phases from September last year. We also carried out other repair and redecoration

works, including revarnishing the timber floors in the Multi-purpose Hall, Library, and Music Rooms. These upgrades reflect our ongoing commitment to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for all Clementians.
