Please find important information for Term 3 below:

1. Start of Term 3

1.1 Term 3 starts on Monday, 29 June 2026.

1.2 It is an official school day and school will start at 7.30 am and end at 1.30 pm as per usual. Lessons will be suspended as all Clementians will be involved in our Do-It-Right Programme.

All Clementians are required to bring a small bag containing a Mother Tongue story book, water bottle, pencil case and a snack.

1.3 Morning flag raising will be held in the hall on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 7.30am sharp. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, students are to report directly to their classrooms. Please ensure that your child/ward is in the school by 7.25am every morning. We will continue to monitor latecomers and when needed, his/her Form Teacher will get in touch with you to find out how best the school and the home can work together to ensure punctuality.

1.4 For safety reasons, Clementians who reach school before 7.05am should report to the school canteen and proceed to the hall or classrooms after 7.05am.

1.5 Please remind your child/ward to bring a Mother Tongue story book for silent reading on Mondays and Tuesdays, and an English story book for Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

2. Safe Management Measures

2.1. The safety of our students is of utmost importance. We seek parents' understanding and assistance to keep schools a safe environment. If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If he/she is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wear a mask, minimise social interactions).

2.2 Smoking is prohibited by law within 5 metres of the school compound. Maintaining a smoke-free environment around the school is essential for the health and well-being of our students, staff, and visitors.

3. School Safety and Security

3.1 All visitors are required to report at the Security Post to obtain a visitor sticker which should be displayed prominently while in the school compound. Thereafter, visitors are required to report to the General Office directly and not access other parts of the campus without authorisation.

4. Revision of Food Prices at Canteen from Term 3 2026

4.1 The last price revision was made more than two years ago. Since then, our canteen stallholders have faced significant increases in the costs of ingredients, utilities and manpower. To ensure the long-term sustainability of our canteen services and to continue providing our students with a variety of affordable and nutritious food options, a price adjustment has become necessary.

4.2 Like many schools, we face challenges in attracting and retaining canteen stallholders. Supporting the viability of our canteen businesses helps us maintain a diverse range of food choices for our students, rather than having to rely on alternative catering arrangements.

4.3 We understand that families are also experiencing cost pressures. The school has therefore worked closely with our stallholders to ensure that any increase will be gradual, reasonable and in line with MOE's guidelines.

4.4 Please be informed that, from 2026 Term 3 onwards, set meal prices will increase by 20 cents, to \$2.20 and \$2.40, for medium and large size respectively. Selected ala carte items will also increase by 10 to 20 cents as well.

4.5 We seek your understanding and support as we balance affordability for families with the need to sustain quality canteen services for our students. Thank you.

4. **Encouraging Students to be Independent**

- 4.1 In the Start-of-Year Term 1 Parent Notification, we sought your cooperation to help Clementians develop good self-management skills and be more independent. Clementians should learn to take personal responsibility to ensure that they are ready for school. This involves completion of homework, packing of school bags and personal belongings for the next school day.
- 4.2 Please note that parents / guardians will not be permitted to deliver these items to Clementians, with the exception of essential medication. If your child has forgotten his/her pocket money, he/she may approach their Form Teacher or the General Office for assistance.
- 4.3 We seek your understanding and cooperation to partner the school to help foster greater independence and sense of responsibility in Clementians.

5. **Assessment Schedule**

- 5.1 **For Primary 6:** Please refer to the table below for the period of assessment for the Primary 6 Preliminary Examination. As the school aims to optimise curriculum time and encourage a culture of continuous learning rather than learning just for examinations, lessons will resume after the Preliminary Examination. More details will be disseminated via PG by Term 3 Week 2.

- 5.2 **For Primary 3 to Primary 5:** This year's Year-End Assessment (YEA) for Primary 3 to Primary 5 Clementians, excluding Oral and Composition, will start from Term 4 Week 6. The detailed Year-End Assessment schedule will be sent out via the Parent's Gateway app by the end of Term 3.

6. **National Physical Fitness Award (NAPFA) – Primary 4**

- 6.1 NAPFA test is one of the measures of one's physical fitness. During PE lessons, Clementians learned about the various test items in the NAPFA test and how these can be used to measure the different components of health and fitness.
- 6.2 Our Primary 4 Clementians will take their NAPFA 5 stations on Monday afternoons in Term 3 Weeks 5 and 6. For the 1.6 km walk/run test item, it will be conducted during PE lessons between Term 3 Weeks 4 and 7. Details and schedules will be sent via the Parents Gateway app nearer the dates.

7. **2026 P1 Registration Exercise – Phase 1 Registration**

- 7.1 Phase 1 registration is for a Singapore Citizen (SC) or Permanent Resident (PR) child born between 2 January 2020 and 1 January 2021 (both dates inclusive) and has a sibling currently studying in our school.

- 7.2 For the 2026 P1 Registration Exercise, parents who are registering their younger child under Phase 1 are to **register during the Phase 1 registration period from 30 June 2026 (Tuesday), 9am to 2 July 2026 (Thursday), 4.30pm** through the P1 Registration Portal. The school has sent a notification pertaining to this on 19 May 2026 via the Parents Gateway app.

8. Upgrading Works

- 8.1 Our school has embarked on the Workplace Re-design Project since June 2025. To date our General Office including the sick-bay, Parent Meeting Room, Conference room and HOD Rooms have been upgraded. The playground together with the EPDM flooring has been replaced to provide a whole new level of excitement as well as promoting upper body strength, coordination and confidence. The air-conditioning of the Multi-Purpose Hall was also completed in February to improve the thermal comfort inside the facility during important school events.
- 8.2 The school has also lined up a series of improvement works to enhance the safety and security of the campus and to improve the conduciveness of the environment for both students and staff. Some are already on-going while the rest will commence in this semester. These include increased CCTV coverage at all levels, new electronic door access system, additional shelters to reduce rain ingress into building, improved sound proofing works at the Music Rooms and enhanced natural ventilation at selected rooms.

9. Home-School Partnership

- 9.1 At the heart of every child's growth is a strong partnership between home and school. When parents and teachers share the same vision — nurturing a child who is confident, curious and kind — that alignment becomes one of the most powerful forces in a child's life. We may play different roles but we are guided by the same goal, one that helps each child thrive not just academically but emotionally and socially as well.
